| 424 | Federal Criminal Code | Copyright Infringement Crimes | <p>Six months to six-year incarceration and a fine equivalent to three hundred to three thousand times the minimum daily wage</p> <p>I. To the person who speculates in any way with free textbooks distributed by the Secretary of Public Education;</p> <p>II. To the publisher, producer, or recorder of a work protected by the Federal Copyright Law who knowingly produces more copies than those authorized by the author;</p> <p>III. To the person who uses works protected by the Federal Copyright Law in a fraudulent, for profit, or unauthorized manner.</p> |
| 424 <i>bis</i> | Federal Criminal Code | Copyright Infringement Crimes | <p>Three to ten-year incarceration and a fine equivalent to two thousand to twenty thousand times the minimum daily wage</p> <p>I. To the person who produces, reproduces, imports, stores, transports, distributes, sells, or rents copies of works, phonograms, videos or books protected by the Federal Copyright Law in a fraudulent way for commercial speculation and without the authorization specified in the abovementioned law.</p> <p>This same penalty to who knowingly provides in any way raw materials or supplies destined for the production or reproduction of works, phonograms, videos, or books mentioned in the above paragraph, or</p> <p>II. To the person who manufactures a for profit device or system with the purpose of deactivating electronic devices that protect a computer program.</p> |

| 424 <i>ter</i> | Federal Criminal Code | Copyright Infringement Crimes | <p>Six-month to six-year imprisonment and a fine equivalent to five thousand to fifty thousand times the minimum daily wage to whomever fraudulently sells at a profit, on the street or in public spaces, to any final consumer copies of works, videos, or books as referred to in section I of the previous article.</p> <p>If the sale is in commercial establishments, or in an organized or permanent manner, what is established in article 424 <i>bis</i> of this Code will be applied.</p> |
| 425 | Federal Criminal Code | Copyright Infringement Crimes | <p>Six-month to two-year imprisonment and a fine equivalent to three hundred to three thousand minimum daily wage to whom knowingly and with no right uses an interpretation or execution.</p> |
| 426 | Federal Criminal Code | Copyright Infringement Crimes | <p>Six months to four-year imprisonment and a fine equivalent to three hundred to three thousand times the minimum daily wage in the following cases:</p> <p>I. To the person who manufactures, imports, sells or rents a device or system to decipher a coded satellite signal that carries programs, without authorization from the legitimate distributor of said signal, and</p> <p>II. To the person who, for profit, deciphers a coded satellite signal that transmits programs without authorization from the legitimate distributor of said signal.</p> |
| 427 | Federal Criminal Code | Copyright Infringement Crimes | <p>Six months to six-year imprisonment and a fine equivalent to three hundred to three thousand times the minimum daily wage to whoever publishes a work substituting the name of the author.</p> |
| 428 | Federal Criminal Code | Copyright Infringement Crimes | <p>The monetary fines of this article will be applied in addition to damage compensation in an amount not less than forty percent of the sale price of each product or the cost of providing the service implicated in one or any of the Copyright Law violations.</p> |

| 429 | Federal Criminal Code | Copyright Infringement Crimes | The infringements foreseen in this Article will be legally prosecuted, except those specified in Articles 424, section II, and 427. |
| 230 | Federal Copyright Law | Copyright Infringements | <p>Copyright infringement will be sanctioned according to what is established in the Federal Law of Administrative processes with fines equivalent to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I. From five thousand to fifteen thousand minimum daily wage in cases foreseen in sections I, II, III, IV, XI, XII, XIII and XIV of the previous article, and II. From one thousand to five thousand minimum daily wage in all other cases specified in the previous article. <p>There will be additional fines for repeat offenders equivalent to up to five hundred minimum salaries per day.</p> |
| 232 | Federal Copyright Law | Copyright Infringements Commercial Infractions | <p>The commercial infractions foreseen in this Law will be sanctioned by the Mexican Institute of Industrial Property with fines equivalent to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> I. Five thousand to ten thousand minimum daily wage in cases included in sections I, III, IV, V, VII, VIII and IX of the previous article; II. One thousand to five thousand minimum daily wage in cases foreseen in sections II and VI of the previous article, and III. Five hundred to one thousand minimum daily wage in all other cases mentioned in section X of the previous article. <p>There will be an additional fine equivalent to up to five hundred minimum salaries per day for repeat offenders.</p> |
| Numeral 49 | UDLAP Intellectual Property Policy | Sanctions for Policy Violation | <p>These could include private or public warning, or corrective actions such as damage compensation, banning from projects, temporary suspension or definite expulsion from the university community.</p> <p>The sanctions imposed on “employees” and “students” will be part of their work or student file, as applicable.</p> |
