In an effort to increase knowledge about the United States Constitution, Congress established Constitution Day. Senator Robert C. Byrd proposed the amendment, which passed in December 2004 and requires all educational institutions to commemorate Constitution Day by offering educational information each year on September 17th.

On September 17th, 1787, the members of the Constitutional Convention signed the U.S. Constitution. The U.S. Constitution serves as the supreme law of the United States of America and is the framework for the United States government.
